Summer Reading Log




Dear Parents,

Reading is the foundation for your child's success in school. Your child has worked hard in first grade and has learned many basic reading skills. In order to help children maintain the progress they have made throughout the school year, it is important that they read over the summer months.

As I get ready to welcome your child into second grade, I have prepared a summer reading list and log. Please encourage your child to read a variety of books. Students are not limited to the suggested list. They may read whatever is of interest to them. It is important that your child choose books on their reading level. The "5 Finger Rule" is a good way to determine if a book is appropriate. When a child tests out a book, have them read a page. For every word that is too hard for them to read, hold up one finger. If they hold up all 4 fingers and their thumb before the page ends, that book is too hard. But it could be a good book for you to read to them.

It is also important that children practice comprehension. Ask your child questions as they read- about the characters, setting, and plot. Maybe they can make predictions about what will happen next. Participating in reading with your child gives them a sense of the importance of reading.

The attached reading log is due on the first day of school. I look forward to hearing about all the great books your child enjoys over the summer. I hope you and your family have a wonderful summer- I'll see you in September.
